

ICE SPEED SKATING NEW ZEALAND Inc

SELECTION POLICY 2009/2010

This Selection Policy covers the period from 1st April 2009, through to the conclusion of the 2010 SeniorWorld Short Track Championships.

- 1) Skaters may qualify for World Cups and / or World Championships by the following methods:
 - a) Competing in sanctioned meetings, either in New Zealand or overseas, with official protocols.
 - b) Participating in selection trials or races either in New Zealand or overseas for which the following requirements must be met –
 - i) Conducted by a referee and starter approved by the National Coach (overseas) or ISSNZ Technical Committee.
 - (ii) Timekeepers must be approved by the referee.
 - (iii) The results must be recorded on the official ISSNZ Protocol sheet and signed by the referee and starter.
 - (iv) If manual timekeeping is used, a minimum of three watches must record the time and all times must be submitted.
- 2) Written results or protocols must be received by the selectors before any possible selection can be ratified
- 3) In the event of more skaters available for selection than places, the selectors recommendation will be communicated to the Board for approval and the Boards decision will be final.
- 4) All time trials must be skated as individual time trials ie unpaced.
- 5) Time trials must be completed and submitted for approval 1 week before closing dates for the respective championships.
- 6) The following are the qualifying times for the 2010 World Championships and World Cups.

JUNIOR:

A Junior is a Skater who has not reached the age of 19 before July 1st preceding the competition and who has reached the age of 14 before July 1st preceding the Championships.

SENIOR:

For ISU Senior Championships, Olympic Winter Games and International Senior Competitions only skaters may compete who have reached at least the age of 15 before July 1st preceding these events.

Long Track Selection Times

To compete in World Cups a skater must have achieved qualifying times as per the ISU communication as set out below.

4. Entry rules

4.1 Qualifying times

All entered skaters (incl. substitutes) must have achieved applicable qualifying times for the respective distances.

For a result to be a valid qualifying time, it must have been achieved in ISU Events, International Competitions or National Championships in the period between *July 1, 2009* and the entry deadline for the World Cup Competition concerned. Exceptionally, the ISU Speed Skating Technical Committee may grant an ISU Member the right to enter maximum one skater per category (Ladies/Men) who has not achieved an applicable qualifying time. The ISU Member should then submit such a request to the ISU Secretariat before the deadline for entries for the World Cup Competition concerned.

NB: Skating the qualifying times makes a skater eligible for consideration to be selected. Qualification does not mean automatic selection

NB: In every case - skaters whose performances and times consistently drop outside the qualifying time may not be considered for selection. The ultimate selection will be

based on performances and will be at the discretion of the selectors in consultation with the National and / or travelling coach.
